Alternating points of view allow readers to see what happens when these two kids make a pact to fulfill their deepest dreams. It's a terrific book about loss and the power of friendship. (PS)

After their ship is attacked by the Djarik, Leo's father, who is a scientist, is kidnapped and Leo is tricked by his brother into stowing away on a pirate's spaceship to get help. Meanwhile, Leo has a hard time deciding who he can trust and has hopes that the pirates will help him rescue his father. Along the way, he begins to wonder who the good guys are and who are the bad. Those who like Star Wars, aliens, and robots will like this one! (EM)

The Last Rabbit

Once, four human girls were sent to a lonely island to live with a Magician and turned into rabbits (the Magician didn't do it!). Now three of them have left the island and become girls again; but Albie, the last rabbit, doesn't want to change back. Alas, the island is sinking—so Albie sets out with the mysterious Boy to find her sisters and to find a place where, perhaps, she also will become a girl again. This generously illustrated tale is an enchanting mixture of magic and myth, philosophy and adventure. (PS)
